




Human Dignity

HIGHLIGHTS

- 2,525 cases of rights violations were documented.
- 717 cases were redressed.
- 37,271 individuals/households accessed various schemes and entitlements.
- 1,53,401 households were benefited by community benefits.
- Focus has been to ensure the rights of children, education of girl child, single women, minority women, domestic workers, construction workers, land and forest rights of Adivasis and other dependent communities, land, health and education of Dalits, WASH rights, etc.

**Food & Nutrition Security**

- 14,530 farmers have adopted sustainable agricultural practices such as IFS, SRI, SCI, NPM, organic farming, etc.
- 2,501 farmers have benefited from access to market linkages.
- 634 farmers were given input support/seed support.
- 2,836 non-forming members have benefited through value addition and income generation activities.
- Development of Model IFS through Green College
- Skill development of youth in local trades such as food processing, poultry, lac cultivation, Fishery, paddy cultivation, etc.
- Micro credit support through revolving fund
- Seed/Grain Banks
- Green/Organic Shops

**Food & Nutrition Security**

- Integrated child development combining nutrition, health and hygiene
- Promotion of diet diversity for lactating mothers
- Elimination of malnutrition with annual screening of mother and child
- Revival of local food systems with awareness campaign, organic outlets, fairs and workshops, urban gardening, safe food canteens/restaurants, etc.
- Promotion of CBOs
 - Farmer Clubs
 - Village Forest Committees
 - Farmer Producer Groups
 - Cooperatives
 - Market Federations

***People Centred Governance***

- In 18 out of 36 GPs, GPDPs were developed and implemented with the participation of the communities.
- 8 GPs are being promoted as Model GPs with 12 criteria such as
 - Regular Gram Sabha Meetings
 - Regular Gram Panchayat Meetings
 - Effective functioning of Standing/Functional Committees
 - Development and Implementation of GPDP
 - Resource Mobilisation
 - Transparency and Accountability
